ON THE POLITICAL FRONT

- 1. Representations made:
- nationalisation of private nursing homes
- ramping-up of elective surgeries (cancer, cardiac and other)
- denouncing the lack of inclusion in Bill 61 of urgent renovation needed at Maisonneuve-Rosemont
- 2. Weekly meeting with the Health Ministers' cabinets during the Covid-19 pandemic
- 3. Appearance before the hearing committee on Bill 56 (family caregivers) and written submission
- 4. Participation in the consultations of the National Prehospital Emergency System Transformation Committee consultation process.
- 5. Advocacy for a re-adjustment of regional distribution of family physicians (PREM)

- Complaint lodged to the Quebec Human Rights Commission for discrimination against seniors in the Critical Care Prioritization Protocol in the context of a pandemic:
- 1. Violation of a person's constitutional right to health care
- 2. Violation of a physician's obligation to provide care
- 3. Right of senior citizens not to be discriminated against


- Complaint to the Commission (continued):
- 4. Prioritization protocol:
 - 1st level, 65+ year old excluded when the prognosis of mortality is 80%
 - 2nd level, 50+ year old excluded when the prognosis of mortality is 50%
- Critères utilisés:
 - Severe trauma: 50+ year-old excluded
 - Severe burn injuries, 60+ year-old excluded
 - Frail clinical conditions:

1st level: 65+ year-old excluded 2nd level: 50+ year-old excluded

- If there is a tie, priority goes to the youngest
- The decision of the prioritization committee is based on an anonymous evaluation sheet, except for the patient's age



SOCIAL MOBILIZATION





- 1. Statement sent to 200 members of Protection Santé and 200 Users' and In-patients' committees urging long-term care facilities to install air conditioning or ventilation equipment
- 2. Media interviews on Covid-19:

Exposing the Government's failure to act promptly in:

identifying, isolating, and treating the patient prioritizing long-term care facilities being prepared for a pandemic (training and equipment)

- 9. Call for an inquiry by the Chief Coroner into the deaths that occurred during the Covid-19 crisis
- 10.Demands for the right to be comfortable and safe at all times and during heat waves, and a memo reminding the committees to report to the CPM observed negligence
- 11.Participation in the Salon Visez Droit of the Montreal Bar Association, and production of a video clip on users' rights and the CPM's advocacy campaigns
