Hello everyone,

Here is an update on various actions and advocacy by the CPM following complaints from residents, family members, and committees:

Some CIUSSS want to replace half-doors in long-term care facilities with full doors with a window in the center of the door.

Half-doors have their purpose and should be allowed in suitable locations. Opening the upper section allows residents not to feel isolated, conveys minimum ventilation, especially in the summer when the air conditioning comes from the hallway or when there is no ventilation system. It partly reduces ambient noises while enabling staff to monitor the safety of the resident.

It also bars residents from entering another resident's room. A full door or a full glass door, as some administrators propose, will not achieve these goals. A few CIUSSSs have already received complaints. We are waiting for the conclusion. If no appropriate action is taken, or if the half-doors were to be replaced without consulting residents, families, or committees, the CPM will continue to make direct representations to relevant decision-makers.

The Future of Long-Term Care: Better home care.

Following the much-appreciated symposium hosted by the CPM on November 10 and attended by over 80 participants, a distinct consensus was achieved on the future of long-term care outside of CHSLDs, that is to say at home, in intermediate resources and private residences for seniors: routine nursing and medical care at home must be assured, in a multidisciplinary fashion, including 24-hour nursing and medical monitoring.

The State and the unions must promote better home care practices by offering better support to family caregivers: 24-hour nursing and medical support must be offered. The seriously ill, especially those in their last year of life, will benefit from this because their desire to remain at home as long as possible will be met; and, especially, hospital emergency rooms will be less crowded than they are at present. The reinforcement of home care must stop being the subject of empty promises by the Quebec Government and become a true priority. The CPM will continue to press our elected officials so that it becomes a reality.
